Message from Mr.B

How quickly time flies; as you can read , the children have done some amazing things this half term. I am particularly proud of the way our new Nursery and Reception children have settled into school. Our curriculum focus this half term has been on science and in particular investigations and experiments. Next half term we will be linking the skills the children have developed and applying them to Design and technology. We have implemented our new phonics scheme "super sonic phonics" and the children have really enjoyed learning new actions and rhymes. We will be inviting EYFS and KS1 parents in to classes to see the teaching—this will build on the information session we shared with you this half term. Miss Lobley has researched additional reading interventions and will be trialling some new ideas in lower KS2 next half term; this is designed to develop key knowledge to enable the children to deepen their understanding of decoding strategies. We are refocussing our attention onto celebrating all the positive aspects of our society and we will be using Picture News to explore the key British values. This work will start with an assembly each week and use a current affairs picture to explore each of the values.

Our multi gym has been a huge success with the children and we are really grateful to the PTA for their support. Please support the Halloween disco on the first Friday back so we can raise money for the next project. Our Honey Money came in at £260 which we will use to support the bees through the winter. Our buildings work over the holiday will be on the main infrastructure of the school. The boiler will be refitted and serviced; the upper school girls toilets are having an overhaul. We are also planning to have KS1 and Lower KS2 bay areas painted and freshened up. Mr Marshall will be replacing the logs on the main climbing frame which will enable the children to access it all again. We have had 2 kitchen inspections this half term and passed them both with 5 star ratings—huge congratulations to Emma our cook and her team. The local authority will be inspecting our fire alarm system over the holiday in preparation for installing a completely new system.

During the first week back we will be sending out nominations to become a parent Governor. Please consider the applying for the role; school governors are a vital support in supporting our school. It is a real opportunity to become involved in the life of the school

Finally, a huge thank you for the increased attendance figures, especially with all the bugs going around; this is much more reflective of what we need. The main cause of the drop last year was unauthorised term time holidays. Please avoid booking them.

A Super Start Reception!

We have had a brilliant first half term in Reception. The teaching team are so proud of the amazing start reception class have had. The children have adapted to school beautifully, taking on all the learning opportunities they have been offered, whilst demonstrating a developing growth mindset ethos to their learning.

This half term we have been exploring lots of different traditional fairy tale stories, including the 'The Billy Goats Gruff', 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. Through these stories we have experienced making and eating yummy gingerbread men, finding giant footprints with golden coins and planting magic beans!



Reception have embraced our new phonic scheme, showing the adults how to do the super actions. This has had a positive impact on the children's reading and writing skills and enjoyment.

Reception have been outstanding role models on Thursday mornings with our nursery friends. In our 'Messy Faces', sessions our EYFS chefs have made hedgehog bread, delicious porridge for the 3 bears and fruity treat linked to 'Handa's Surprise'. During 'Muddy Faces', the children have demonstrated teamwork and perseverance, they loved playing VANISH hide and seek, going on a scavenger hunt, building a bridge to help the Billy Goats escape the cheeky troll and den building!

To finish the topic they created water colour illustrations and blew us all away with their fabulous drawing and painting skills.

Year 3 Creativity

We have been getting creative in Year 3 this half term! In art, we have explored the work of Laura McKendry who uses charcoal to make large gestural drawings of dogs. We explored using the charcoal to create lines, shape and tone and thought about how charcoal can be used to represent light and dark. Inspired by historic images of cave art, we then used the techniques we had practiced to explore gestural cave paintings. We all had a fantastic time!
