#### Message from Mr.B

What an amazing year and I have really enjoyed celebrating the Xmas productions with Early Years and Key stage 1; they made me very proud. The quality of singing has continued to improve and the enormous number of parents and grand parents at the carol concert were treated to a fabulous performance. I am really happy that our attendance has improved by nearly 1 percent on this time last year; well done to our year 2 children as they achieved the best attendance again this year. Also, a huge well done to the 65 children who have achieved 100% attendance this year. Unfortunately there is still an issue with term time unauthorised holidays and I need to remind parents of the change in legislation. The fixed penalty notice of £80 per parent per child applies to the first unauthorised holiday. If there is a second unauthorised holiday within a 3 year period then the charge rises to £160 per parent per child and if there is a third within that time frame parents will be prosecuted by the Magistrates Court. Please support us by not booking term time holidays.

Our school improvement work this term has been focussing on deepening our understanding of how children learn and retain knowledge. We have been using Deans for Impact research (science of learning) to identify aspects that we do well and those we need to improve. This work has run alongside developing our strategies for adaptive teaching to ensure no child is left behind and everyone is included. This work has been moderated by our Local Authority school improvement partner as part of her annual inspection and her comments were extremely complimentary. A report will be produced for Governors in the New Year. Our new phonics scheme is working really well and the children are enjoying the new actions and songs. Miss Lobley and one of our Governors did lesson observations and spoke to the children and were pleased with outcomes and the consistency of practice from Nursery to Year 2. Further training will take place next year to maintain the momentum we have developed since September.

Our building work over the holiday will be deep cleaning the school and decoration of the kitchen area. We will also complete the Upper KS2 bay area with an interactive TV to give the children working there wider access to resources and lesson notes.

It has been a truly fantastic year and I would like to thank all my colleagues for their dedication and commitment to making Torkington such a special place to be. I would like to thank and congratulate Mr Bethell and Mrs Hollinshead for their hard work in achieving HLTA status—a qualification which enables them to cover classes. Happy Xmas everyone—have a wonderful time.
