Message from Mr.B

I would like to thank all my colleagues for the fantastic effort running the school for the 2 weeks of my Jury service., much appreciated. There has been lots to celebrate and I would like to thank all the parents and grandparents that supported our year 3 and 2 assemblies this half term. The hall was full and the children really enjoyed sharing their work with you.

We have had a change in curricular leadership; Mr Waugh will now lead science, Miss Kempton will take over Geography and Miss Roberts will head up history. Colleagues have been working hard to interpret their new subjects and we will develop this further on our INSET day a week on Monday. We will also be working on the displays in school, particularly in the hall to ensure the childrens' work in all subjects is celebrated. A key focus for next half term will be developing the role of the subject coordinator to ensure the experience our children have in the core subjects is replicated in the Foundation subjects (history, Art etc). We will be guided in this work by our School Improvement Partner and the consultancy support from Mary Myatt, a renowned educational specialist. Our audit from the adaptive teaching work was really pleasing and the strategies and techniques to include all of our children in their learning are working well. We conducted pupil voice exercises in Maths, English and SEND and the results are positive but also the children have highlighted areas we can improve. They have really appreciated the improved challenge elements that we worked on from September.

Our building work over the half term will involve getting the meadows ready for spring. Several posts have rotted and the ropes need fixing as well as the old vegetation being cut back ready for the new growth. We are also planning to paint our Year 1 and 2 classrooms. The bulk of the week will be spent deep cleaning the classrooms and shared spaces. The children have been brilliant in changing their shoes and using the new upper school shoe racks, it has really helped keep the mud at bay. Please can you ensure your child has a change of shoe after the holiday. We will be having a cleaning audit next half term in the light of the increase in the various viruses and bugs that are affecting all schools. We want our school to be as clean as possible and we are emphasising the use of hand sanitiser and regular hand washing.

We are continuing to explore the road safety issues around parking outside school and on the pavements. We have had planning permission delayed to have fences and other measures to improve the safety of our children. Please avoid parking opposite school on the pavements—parents with buggies and small children are having to use the road to get round cars.

We have had lots of fundraising activities in school over the past few months. Most recently The Sammy Clothes Collection which raised an outstanding £207, The Valentines Disco raised an amazing £324, and a fabulous £446 from the Asda Rewards campaign. The total amount raised so far since the fundraising started again in September is £4072. Thank You to everyone who has made this possible.

Our PTA are currently in discussions on what they are saving for and how the money is going to be spent within school over the next few months.

Here come the dinosaurs in Nursery!

Nursery have had a lot of fun this Half Term. We have especially enjoyed our Dinosaur Topic. We used stories such as Harry and his bucketful of Dinosaurs to inspire our learning. We began the Topic by taking part in a dinosaur workshop provided to us by The Freshwater Theatre Company. During the session the children embarked on an imaginary journey in which the facilitator led the children around the hall to pick up clues from different locations such as the Forest and a cave. Using songs, rhymes and activities, the children helped to create their own Dinosaur story.



We ended the topic by taking part in a volcano science experiment. We watched as the vinegar and bicarbonate of soda created an expanding foam to imitate an eruption and resemble the lava.


Year 6 Holocaust Memorial Day

Junior Swimming
